Annual Meeting

The Annual Membership meeting will be held on Thursday February 14th @ 7:00PM. A Board of Directors meeting will be held directly following the Annual Meeting

The agenda for all board meetings is posted in advance at the entrance to the Clubhouse. Monthly meetings are open to all homeowners. The 15-20 minute Open Forum session at the start is an opportunity to have any issues heard by the board, association manager, and others present, and to ask questions about any projects or decisions addressed by the board.

Following Open Forum, the meeting is limited to those issues posted on the agenda. Homeowners are welcome and encouraged to stay and observe, but this part of the meeting is closed to owner participation. Minutes of all meetings are posted on the website after they have been approved at the next board meeting.

No Board of Directors Election

Only the three incumbents currently serving on the Board presented applications to run for the Board. As there are only three openings there will be no election and the incumbents will retain their positions.

Violations Notice

Be sure that you and, if applicable, your tenants follow the rules of the community. An immediate fine hearing may be called for violations of the CC&Rs or Operating Rules.

E-Statements

Did you know you can sign up for e-statements. Signing for e-statements reduces your mailings by the Association? This can save the Association several hundreds of dollars each year in operating costs, which in turn helps keep Homeowner dues lower! Signing up for e-statements also greatly reduces the risk of notices being lost on their way to you. 

CALLING 911

- Call 911 immediately if you see any suspicious activity
- Suspicious activity includes anything that feels uncomfortable or looks out of place. You know your neighborhood best, trust your instincts.
- Examples: strangers loitering in your neighborhood, a person looking into cars or company uniform removing packages from a front patio, solicitors selling goods while they are away, individuals that are not wearing an identifiable delivery windows, open or broken doors or windows, people arriving at a neighbor's home or services without a solicitor photo ID card from the City
- and as detailed a description as possible of people and vehicles Provide 911 with an exact location, an overview of the activity you've observed
